

We are thrilled to share that Longmont United Hospital has received an 'A' rating in both the Fall 2024 and Spring 2025 Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grades.

The Leapfrog Group evaluates hospitals across the country on their performance in preventing medical errors, injuries, accidents and infections, then assigns an A through F grade accordingly.

Our 'A' is the result of thoughtful planning and the commitment of every one of our team members to the safety and outcomes of their patients throughout the care journey. Donor support elevates every aspect of our work at Longmont United Hospital, including our dedication to patient safety and an exceptional experience at every visit. These are our collective accomplishments to celebrate!



LUH employees give back to enhance hospital care

Longmont United Hospital employees are deeply invested in the health and well-being of their neighbors. So much so, that many of our team members are also foundation donors – **supporting our iCount Employee Giving Campaign to ensure a healthy future for their community**.

"I've been a supporter of the foundation since 2016," says General Surgeon, David Donahue, DO. "The foundation has provided support for our physicians and staff by investing in the operating room, helping us with building projects and



various other initiatives. We are very appreciative."

110 employees have collectively donated more than\$50,000 to the foundation, in support of hospital initiatives and community programs like these, among others:

Facility renovations and a \$43,000 ultrasound machine for The BirthPlace at Longmont United Hospital. The BirthPlace is the only birthing center of its kind in the Longmont area, offering personalized, patient- and family-centered birth experiences.

A \$60,000 AirSeal[®] machine to be paired with our state-of-the-art da Vinci robot, improving our surgeons' visibility and precision for even the most complex procedures.

\$50,000 disbursed to the Longmont Salud Clinic's ButtSavers program – supporting low-cost colonoscopies for roughly 125 community members, some of whom received lifesaving treatments as a result!


