The incredible life and legacy of Warren Johnson, MD

On July 24, 2025, St. Anthony Summit Cardiology held a dedication ceremony to honor the memory of cardiologist Dr. Warren Johnson.

Dr. Johnson established the first cardiology practice in Summit County. He was the Medical Director of Cardiology for the St. Anthony Summit Medical Center formerly under Centura Health and was the founding director of the High Altitude Research Center before his retirement.

Throughout his career, Dr. Warren Johnson made significant contributions to interventional cardiology and received numerous accolades for his work, helping to shape the future of the field. Some of his many contributions included teaching angioplasty techniques to physicians around the world, authoring influential academic studies, participating in clinical trials and touching the lives of countless patients.

An avid outdoorsman, Warren was known for his boundless optimism, infinite patience, sense of

humor, wisdom and compassion. Whether in the hospital, on a mountain trail, or surrounded by his family — his kindness, humility and gentle spirit left a lasting impression on all who knew him.

He passed away on March 4, 2025, at the age of 81. His legacy endures through the countless lives he touched as a physician, mentor, husband, father, grandfather and friend.

We're proud to share that the Systemwide Mental Assessment Response Team (SMART) program — created in partnership with St. Anthony Summit Hospital and the Summit County Sheriff's Office — has been recognized with a CommonSpirit Health Humankindness and Health Justice award.

This innovative collaboration brings together law enforcement, behavioral health specialists and case managers to respond to individuals in a mental health crisis with compassion and expertise. In 2024, the program diverted 87% of patients from the emergency department, ensuring they received the right care in the right setting.
