

2 Community explores robotic surgery options at open house

Our Foundation was honored to support and host a special open house last November at St. Anthony Summit Hospital. This community event invited families, schools and community members to explore the robotic-assisted surgery options available to patients, including the new da Vinci Xi® surgical system.

With interactive simulations and educational demonstrations from surgeons like Scott Otto, MD, guests could talk with physicians, test the technology themselves and learn what to expect if they or a family member undergoes surgery.

3 New mammography equipment enhances patient experience

Thanks to the generous support of our community, our Foundation has fully funded a new mammography unit for the Breast Imaging Program at St. Anthony Summit Hospital.

The Hologic 3Dimensions Mammography unit will enhance the already high-quality care experience for patients. With the introduction of synthetic 2D imaging, the amount of time a patient will need to hold their breath is significantly reduced — a particularly vital feature in our high-altitude environment. The unit is also equipped with curve compression paddles, creating a more comfortable experience.

Sage Schabo, Director of Clinical Shared Services, shares that the new unit also features "notably improved ergonomics for our technologists, a high-resolution monitor that enhances their ability to identify abnormalities during evaluations, and the introduction of synthetic 2D mammography capabilities — which reduces radiation exposure by nearly half — and decreases scan times." These advantages for caregivers ultimately benefit patients, as it has the potential to ensure quicker access to services needed.

The Foundation disbursed a total of \$417,000 to grant this request. We are thrilled that we could serve our patients and community with this new equipment!

5 Healing brain injury with knowledge

We helped welcome nearly 100 physicians and caregivers to Summit County for the Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) Conference last November. With support from Foundation funds, the TBI Conference gathered professionals from near and far to continue learning how to best treat patients experiencing brain injuries and concussions.

As one of the top adventure tourism destinations in the country, we are honored to help keep our caregivers trained to provide care in these difficult situations. One attendee noted: "What was most helpful was learning the overall picture of how head injuries are being treated from the different stages of treatment."

The speaker list featured several of our St. Anthony Summit Hospital physicians, including Jay Johannigman, MD, FACS, FCCM, who shared: "I had a blast and am privileged to be part of the Summit team. What a wonderful conference."

Thanks to contributions from our generous donors, we are very pleased to announce that we have once again opened our Scholarship Program to St. Anthony Summit Hospital employees this spring.

Applications will be accepted between May 1 and June 30, and eligible employees may receive awards of up to \$20,000 in scholarship funds for advanced education in a medical field. Last year, we were able to disburse nearly \$50,000 total to six employees. These scholarships provide our employees with the opportunity to pursue their goals and advance their careers.
