

As Flight for Life enters enters an exciting period of growth this year, our fleet will be re-branded with the CommonSpirit logo and colors — furthering the confidence that **our neighbors are being served by a leading non-profit health system, with the same skilled and compassionate crew members they know and trust**. The updates ensure the highest level of safety for patients and caregivers, incorporating design elements that are easily recognizable in even the most challenging conditions.

The gift of education – and excellence

Thanks to generous donor contributions, we are once again offering scholarships to St. Anthony Summit Hospital employees this spring.

Applications will be accepted from May 1 through June 30, and eligible employees may receive awards of up to \$20,000 to advance their education in the medical field. To date, 36 employees have received a collective \$300,000 in scholarship funding, enabling them to pursue their career goals and strengthen their commitment to serving our neighbors in Summit County.

With our new regional hospice director onboarded, CommonSpirit Bristlecone Home Health has seen significant growth in recent months. We are thrilled to begin the hiring process for additional caregivers and staff, as well as to continue planning to resume hospice services at Bristlecone this year.

Our donors play a significant part in the compassionate end-of-life care we provide to our neighbors in Summit County, helping to cover the cost of grief counseling for families, education for our care team, transportation assistance and more.

Many of our supporters have been touched by hospice in their own lives, inspiring them to help others who are facing a similar journey. 
