1) First robotic spine surgery made possible by philanthropy

We recently had the privilege of supporting an exciting milestone at CommonSpirit St. Mary-Corwin Hospital: completing our first robotic spine surgery!

Funded partially by the St. Mary-Corwin Health Foundation, the state-of-the-art robotic guidance system allows surgeons to visualize the patient's anatomy, plan the procedure in 3D and perform with precision using robotic guidance.

"With this system, we can give patients at SMC more confidence that their individualized procedure, whether minimally invasive or open, will meet their treatment needs," says Christina Koshak, MD. "Bringing this technology to SMC allows us to treat patients close to home, right here in Pueblo."

2 Cost of Poverty Experience inspires leaders

In partnership with the El Pomar Foundation, we are grateful for leadership from Mike Cafasso, Chief Executive Officer at St. Mary-Corwin Hospital, who sponsored the Cost of Poverty Experience (COPE) on February 2.

With more than 100 community leaders in attendance, the nearly three-hour simulation explored the realities of poverty firsthand through the eyes of real families. The experiential training helps organizations and communities more deeply understand the human and systemic impacts of poverty.

Mike Cafasso expressed gratitude to Bishop Stephen Berg of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Pueblo, Mayor Heather Graham, members of the Pueblo Fire and Police Departments, education leaders, members from the Greater Pueblo Chamber of Commerce and more, for their participation and commitment to uniting around our mission: to improve the health of those we serve, especially the most vulnerable.

In America, 37 million people, including 1 in 6 children, live at or below the poverty line.

We were also honored to present Michele Sweeney, MD, with the Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of her years of service to Pueblo Community College's EMS Education program and as a founder of the Southern Colorado Emergency Medical Association (SCEMA).

The Wilz Trauma Symposium is named in memory of Dr. Bill Wilz, who served as St. Mary-Corwin Hospital's trauma medical director until 1999 and is remembered fondly as a teacher, colleague and friend. Lynette (Wilz) Belkin and family shared this special note of gratitude:

Applications will be accepted between May 1 and June 15, and eligible employees may receive awards of up to \$20,000 in scholarship funds for advanced education in a medical field. Last year, we were able to disburse \$24,000 total to four employees.
